

Health & Safety Policy Statement

(Health & Safety at work (NI) Order 1978)

STATEMENT OF INTENT

At AW Control Systems health and safety are of utmost importance. We are committed and dedicated to providing our employees with a safe place of work during the design, manufacturing and installation of electrical control systems and to ensure that injury and ill health are prevented wherever possible. We will at least review this policy annually or sooner if necessary.

Our statement of general policy is:

- treat the management of health and safety as equal to all our other business activities and continually seek to improve our systems;

- to provide and maintain safe plant and equipment;
- to ensure safe handling and use of substances;

- to ensure all employees are competent to do their tasks, and to give them adequate training;
- to prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health;
- to maintain safe and healthy working conditions; and
- to review and revise this policy as necessary at regular intervals.
- to adhere to all applicable health and safety legal requirements in whatever jurisdiction we are working.

This policy, which provides the framework for setting our health and safety objectives, shall be communicated and understood by all our employees and made available to relevant interested parties.
